Why do we have a Corpus Christi procession?

To openly affirm our faith in Jesus Christ, who is alive and truly present in the Eucharist. We publicly adore, praise and thank the Lord, who continues to love us 'to the end', even to the offering of his body and his blood. The Eucharist is the gift that Jesus Christ makes of himself. Here we see God's infinite love for everyone of us. How do I know that God loves me? Here He is in the Blessed Sacrament just for me!

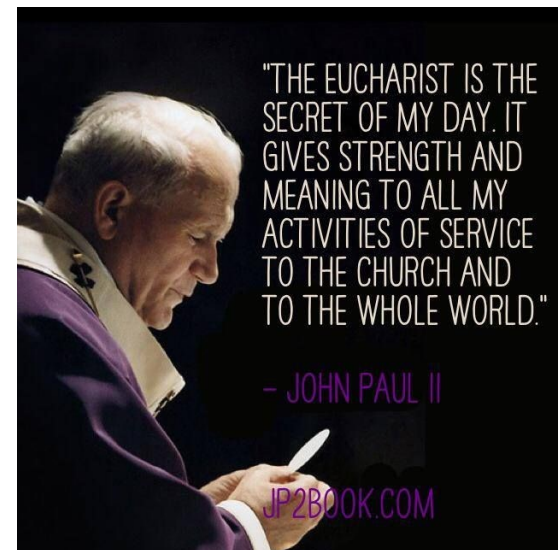
Corpus Christi is like a renewal of Holy Thursday in which we proclaim from "the housetops" what Jesus told the Apostles in secret. The Apostles received the gift of the Eucharist from the Lord in the intimacy of the Last Supper, but it was destined for all of us, for the whole world. At the Holy Thursday procession we accompany Jesus in his loneliness to the "via crucis." At the Corpus Christi procession, on the contrary, we respond symbolically to the mandate of the Risen One: I go before you to Galilee. Go to the end of the earth, take the Gospel to the world. The Blessed Sacrament should be proclaimed and exposed to view: so that each one may encounter "Jesus who passes by" as happened on the roads of Galilee, Samaria and Judea; in order that each one, in receiving it, may be healed and renewed by the power of His love.

Precisely because this is a mysterious reality that surpasses our understanding, we must not be surprised if today too many find it hard to accept the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. It cannot be otherwise. This is how it has been since the day when, in the synagogue at Capernaum, Jesus openly declared that he had come to give us his flesh and his blood as food. This seemed "a hard saying" and many of his disciples withdrew when they heard it. Then, as now, the Eucharist remains a "sign of contradiction" and can only be so because a God who makes himself flesh and sacrifices himself for the life of the world throws human wisdom into crisis. We need to be souls of faith. It is not enough to know in theory, we have to be men and women of the Eucharist in practice. When Jesus extends that invitation to believe and eat to us how do we respond? Like the many who walked no more in Our Lord's company? Or like Peter who declares: "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life" (Jn 6:68)?

St Luke, narrating the miracle of the multiplication of the five loaves and two fish with which Jesus fed the multitude "in a lonely place", concludes with the words: "And all ate and were satisfied" (cf. Lk 9:11-17). Think of this "all". The Mass is for everyone. If I attend Mass and receive Our Lord worthily I will receive all the graces I need to lead a happy Christian life – even though there may be many setbacks and contradictions. But I can't go like a sack of potatoes. I have to put in the effort that I can. The two fish and five loaves signify our own contribution at the offertory, poor perhaps but necessary, which as bread and wine he transforms (transubstantiates) into the gift of the Eucharist. My work and my sufferings offered up to God. The Eucharist is, thus, a call to holiness and to the gift of oneself to those around us: "Each of us is truly called, together with Jesus, to be bread broken for the life of the world".

Mary, Mother of the Lord, really shows us what it is to enter into communion with Christ: Mary offered her own flesh, her own blood, to Jesus, and became the living tent of the Word, allowing herself to be penetrated in body and spirit by his presence. Let us ask her, our Holy Mother, to help us to open our being ever more to the presence of Christ, to help us to follow him faithfully, day after day.
